FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

APRIL 28, 2024

Today's gospel teaches us through a parable about the Hebrew image of God's people as a vine. However, the new Israel is part of the vine (the branches). As the real vine, Jesus brings true life from the Father. Failure to bear fruit means failure to share in that divine life. Sharing in that vine-life means sharing it with others. The Catholic's response, to "abide in me" is essentially a commitment to productivity "because apart from me you can do nothing". And "Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers." Jesus farewell discourse to his disciples, given at the Last Supper, began in John's Gospel. Now that Jesus has basically completed his parable of the vine (himself) and the branches (the disciples), he relates it to the present setting. The disciples will receive whatever they ask so long as they remain wedded to Jesus. It is by that fruitfulness that they are disciples, and it is in that fruitfulness that they glorify God. It is the disciples who continue the mission of Jesus. In reaching out to the hurting and oppressed, we announce that God is the champion of the poor. In comforting the sorrowful, we state that God is the source of consolation.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick takes place every First Saturday after the Vigil Mass.

The Catholic Home Missions Appeal supports parishes and missions across the United States.
