<u>LENTEN</u> REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and Good Friday, March 29, 2024, are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday. Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every Tuesday at 10:00 am Stations of the Cross every Friday in Lent at 4:00 pm

At the entrance of the church there is a small booklet called **The Season for Healing Hearts** for use daily during Lent. Please take one per family and enjoy courtesy of a faithful parishioner.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AFTER THE SATURDAY VIGIL MASS

Beginning on February 3, the First Saturday of month, and every First Saturday to follow, the anointing of the sick will be administered after the 5:00 pm Vigil Mass. The holy oil is for those who are not feeling well or those who might be going for surgery. Take this opportunity to receive this special sacrament when you can.

Commitment Weekend

February 10/11, 2024 – Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lv 13:1-2, 44-46 1 Cor 10:31—11:1 Mk 1:40-45

As we delve into the Gospel of Mark, we encounter a poignant moment in the ministry of Jesus—a leper approaches him, kneels down, and pleads, "If you wish, you can make me clean." In response, Jesus, moved with compassion, reaches out and touches the leper, saying, "I will; be clean." Immediately, the leprosy leaves him, and he is cleansed.

This story speaks volumes about the transformative power of compassion and the healing touch of Christ. It is a narrative that resonates deeply with the mission of our Catholic Faith Appeal. In this annual call to generosity, we are invited to extend the compassionate touch of Christ to those in our community who are in need, just as Jesus did with the leper.

The leper, considered an outcast, approached Jesus with faith and humility. In our community, there are those who may feel like spiritual or social outcasts, burdened by various challenges. Our contributions to the Catholic Faith Appeal provide an opportunity for us to reach out, just as Jesus did. Through our collective generosity, we become instruments of healing and hope. Notice the immediate response of the healed leper. He was told by Jesus to go and show himself to the priest, following the prescribed ritual for reintegration into the community. Similarly, our contributions to the Catholic Faith Appeal enable the Church to carry out its mission of reconciliation and inclusion. We become partners in restoring and uplifting those who may have been marginalized or forgotten.

The healed leper couldn't contain his joy; he began to proclaim the good news everywhere he went. Likewise, our support for the Catholic Faith Appeal is an opportunity for us to joyfully proclaim the good news of Christ's love. Our contributions enable the Church to continue its mission, spreading the message of hope and salvation to all corners of our community. May our generosity reflect the compassion of Christ, reaching out to those in need.
