## FATHER YORK

#### 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Priesthood Father Richard R. York, M.A., M. Div. Ordained a Roman Catholic Priest, May 19, 1973

Father York was born in 1946 in Mount Holly, New Jersey, and is the third of eight children. Father attended LaSalle University and Saint Charles Seminary, both in Philadelphia. Father York served at several parishes as Parochial Vicar before being appointed as Pastor to parishes from 1987 through 2021 and then retiring after six years as our Pastor of Saint Francis of Assisi Parish.

In addition to parish ministry, Father was a professor of Pastoral Theology and Adjunct Faculty at the Theological Seminary of Saint Charles Borromeo in Overbrook, PA., while also serving as Archdiocesan Director of Hispanic Ministry. Prior to his Pastorate at St. Francis, Father served as Pastor of Saint Andrew Parish in Cape Coral, and spent eight years at the Cathedral in Venice and six years at Holy Cross in Palmetto. Since retirement as Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi, Father continues his Priestly Ministry at Saint Francis of Assisi Church and at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Boca Grande.

Father York anticipated the celebration of his 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Priesthood by celebrating a mass with just his family members present, here at Our Lady of Mercy on February 19<sup>th</sup> of this year. We are very grateful for his continuing assistance to us at Our Lady of Mercy.
